Hello Fellowship,





Being a Trustee on the Intergroup Board

Serving as a Trustee on the Intergroup Board brings with it some responsibilities as well as rewards. The trustees perform the following tasks:

- Attend Board meetings monthly
- Serve on committees which may or may not involve further outside service work
- Visit groups around the whole Intergroup area in an effort to promote Intergroup's service to the fellowship which may involve some traveling
- Attending and supporting Intergroup sponsored activities
- Selecting and supervising the Executive Secretary who is responsible for the day-to-day management of the office

These duties are in addition to serving as the trusted servants who maintain Intergroup's financial standing, adherence to Traditions, and fulfilling of our mission to carry the message to those outside of the Fellowship. The Trustees are the voting body of the Association.

By Intergroup by-laws, Trustees must have a minimum of 2 years of sobriety. They serve a three year overlapping term to provide continuity within the Board. Trustees do not receive any monetary compensation. However, the rewards of service are many.

Recognizing that Intergroup is budgeted around a half million dollars a year including the bookstore, the Board requires a mix of people with a variety of backgrounds. Both business (financial, marketing, retail sales, and cyber infrastructure) and A.A. service structure backgrounds are needed as is a good knowledge of our Traditions.

Serving on the Intergroup Board of Trustees is a very rewarding opportunity. We get to see the results and feedback on our work on a monthly basis. However, it is not a position to be taken lightly. The success of Intergroup over time rests largely on your shoulders. Please consider this opportunity well before making a commitment.

Trustees Application Form





Anonymity protects Alcoholics Anonymous, the Fellowship, and the still suffering alcoholic.


